- Notes:
1. Please read the General Rules and Regulations at the front of this book. It is recommended that exhibitors submit entry forms early to have tags prepared.
 2. All articles must be handcrafted by using needle art techniques, design and stitched in harmony with suitable materials (fibres).
 3. The Committee is authorized to disqualify all soiled, defaced or old work. Articles must be free of offensive odours and may be eliminated/disqualified prior to judging.
 4. The judges are instructed to award prizes for new and up to date work worthy of a prize and the work of the exhibitor.
 5. All items must be made by exhibitor unless otherwise stated.
 6. Exhibitors may enter only one item per section unless otherwise stated.
 7. Use safety pins to attach Entry Tags; no straight pins allowed.
 8. Afghan measurements do not include the fringe.
 9. Items may only be exhibited once, with the exception of UFOs, which can be shown again as a finished quilt.
 10. "Item" is one article, with the exception of a pair of socks or mitts.

1. Every quilt must consist of three (3) layers (outer fabric, filler, and outer fabric).
 2. Attach sample of the three (3) layers of fabric please.
 3. All work must be done by the individual entering article if hand quilted.

- Note: Quilts in sections a) – g) must be a minimum of 324" measured on perimeter to be considered for further competition. Other sizes will still be judged.

MACHINE QUILTED ONLY

- Notes: 1. Quilts in sections a) – c) must be a minimum of 324" measured on perimeter to be considered for further competition. Other sizes will still be judged.
 2. Realizing that quilts now are done by long arm machines, it has become necessary to request that names of both the quilter and the person who has assembled the quilt to be presented on the Entry Form so acknowledgement can be given. These quilts must be quilted and assembled solely by the exhibitor in order to enter District Competition.

150th ANNIVERSARY QUILT COMPETITION

The Bracebridge Agricultural Society is celebrating its 150th year in 2017 and to commemorate this anniversary is holding a quilt contest.

The winning quilt will go on permanent display in the Exhibit Hall at the Bracebridge fairgrounds.

1st place winner(s) will receive \$500.

2nd and 3rd place winner(s) will receive \$50 and \$30 respectively.

Deadline for submission is July 15, 2017.

Rules:

1. Quilt must be themed to reflect the history of the Bracebridge Fall Fair and of agriculture in Muskoka.
2. Quilt may be done by 1 (one) person or a group.
3. Quilt must be a minimum of 324" on the perimeter.
4. Quilt may be hand or machine done.
5. Quilt may be in any technique—pieced, appliquéd, embroidered, or any combination of these.
6. Quilts other than the 1st place winning quilt may be entered into the fall fair in September 2017.
7. Quilts will be judged on workmanship and how well they represent the theme.

1. Spun on a wheel or spindle.
 2. 10 yards and 2 ply skein minimum.
 3. Entrants must specify the fibre used and what the skein is to be used for.

1. Skein - spun by a novice spinner who has spun less than 2 years
2. Skein - spun by an experienced spinner
3. Skein - spun into a novelty yarn
4. Skein - spun from exotic fibre (any non-sheep fibre)
5. An item made from 100% handspun yarn

WEAVING

1. An item of clothing
2. An item for household use
3. A decorative item
4. Any other hand woven item

BASKETRY

1. Basket made in a workshop
2. Basket made individually from kit.
3. Basket made independently with original design
4. Basket made from highly creative design
5. Basket made from an original design in conjunction with a non-reed material
6. Basket adapted from original design
