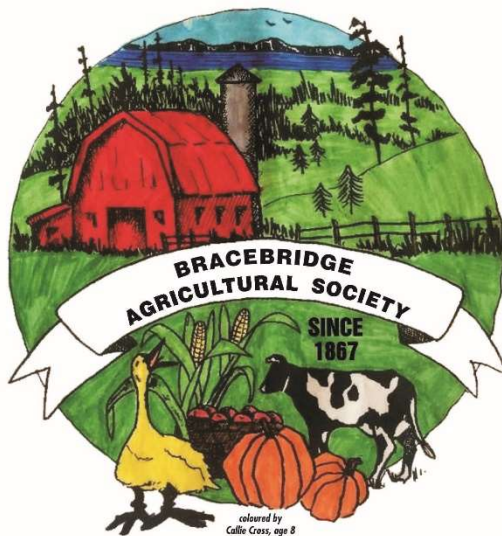

It can be delivered to the Exhibit Hall on **Thursday, September 15th, 2022 between 12:00-9:00pm**. Visitors acknowledge and comment on the student's creativity. In fact, families look for their own school display in the Art Category. To encourage participation in this category, the Junior Fall Fair Committee will gladly collect your Art display in the spring and store it for presentation at the Fall Fair.

PUPILS, BEFORE ENTERING THE JUNIOR FALL FAIR, PLEASE READ THE RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. Participation in the Junior Fall Fair shall be open to all pupils who have been properly enrolled in the school year, that is all schools in South and Central Muskoka including Home Schooling (Contact - Christena Slater -705-645-8833) and summer residents (Contact - Committee Chair or the Fair Secretary at 705-646-3419).
2. Grades in the school year shall be as of **May 31, 2022**. ENTER THAT CATEGORY ONLY.
3. The work of choosing and preparing articles for exhibit **MUST BE DONE BY THE PUPIL**. Teachers and parents are urged to give advice and encouragement. Articles may be disqualified if **ALL WORK** is done by an adult. Items **MUST** be made in the current Junior Fair year, past year will not be judged.



4. Entries in Classes 1-156 must be placed in the Main Exhibit Hall between 12:00-9:00pm **on Thursday, September 15th**.

5. Entries will be judged on Friday, September 16th, and must remain in place at the owner's risk until 4:00pm on **Sunday, September 18th**. Items must be picked up between 4:00-5:00pm.

Note: Items not picked by 5:00pm will **NOT** be returned to the Schools and are forfeit.



6. All exhibits must be accompanied by an Entry Tag showing the entry category/class number (not grade), article description, pupil's name, and name of school attended.

7. Homeschoolers are requested to register their phone number and address with a committee member at time of drop-off. Do not include them on the Entry Tag.

8. Entry Tags may be made up by hand, or are available from your School Office or at the Fair Office commencing Monday, September 12th between 10:00am-8:00pm.

GUIDELINES FOR SHOWING JUNIOR FAIR EXHIBITS

VEGETABLES

1. Vegetables should be uniform in size, same length with no outside roots, tomatoes and potatoes uniform in size.
2. Baskets will be provided for Vegetable displays.
3. Read descriptions carefully (e.g. tops trimmed, colour of specimen, (no tears or spots, etc) and uniform in size.
Remove old or dying blooms and foliage.
4. Blooms should be shown with their own foliage.
5. Note any size restrictions (e.g. Arrangements).
6. Size of Marigolds are -- small - 2 - 5 cm, medium - 4 - 8 cm, large - over 8 cm (exhibit should be of one colour).
7. Roses should only be half to three-quarters open.
8. Snapdragons and Gladioli should have straight stems. Florets should have bottom 40% open, the next 30% buds, and the top 30% unopened.

BAKING

1. Baking must be displayed on a clean, sturdy reusable plate (no paper plates), placed inside a clear sealed plastic bag
2. Baking should be of uniform size, shape and colour (e.g. Cookies).
