The following is a listing of the Classes offered for the Youth Division (High School) at the Bracebridge Fall Fair and Horse Show, September 18, 19, and 20, 2020

Notes;

1. Entries may be placed in the Trans Canada Pipeline Building, Fairgrounds on Thursday, September 17 from 7:00 – 9:00 p.m. and **must** be in place by **11:30 a.m.**, Friday, September 18 ready for judging. Pick-up time is **4:00 p.m.** Sunday, September 20. Anyone removing exhibits before 4:00 p.m. shall forfeit their prize money. Prize Lists are available at the High Schools, Bracebridge Public Library, *bracebridgefair.com* or the Youth Division Chair 705-706-1147.
2. Entry Tags **must** be attached to each exhibit.
3. There is **no membership required to enter into the Classes of the Youth Fair only.**
4. All Youth entering a total of five (5) or more entries in at least two (2) Classes of the Youth Division will receive a **FREE one (1) day admission** to the Fall Fair. The admission may be obtained when the entries are delivered to the Trans Canada Pipeline Exhibit Hall.
5. All work may have been completed in the past or current school year with the exception of Classes 40 and 45 which must be done in the current year. No item previously exhibited may be entered again.
6. Submit your list of entries (form attached) to the Fair Secretary. Only **one** entry per class/section.
7. The Committee reserves the right to remove inappropriate or offensive material from judging or display.
8. **ALL** Prize Money and Special Awards will be presented at Appreciation night on Thursday, October 22. Any cheques not picked up at that time will subsequently be mailed to the address provided on the entry form.

CLASS 36 ART

Note: For the protection of the Art, **all** entries should have firm backing to allow them to be hung up where our visitors can't touch them.

MUSKOKA ARTS & CRAFTS SPECIAL AWARD - \$20.00 to the student showing potential in Art.

MARTIN'S FRAMING GALLERY ART SUPPLIES SPECIAL AWARD – \$20.00 Gift Certificate - Judge's Choice of best in class.

1. **Collage:** paper, fabric, found objects, etc. glued to a surface.
2. **Abstract/Design:** any drawing or painting medium (shape, line, and colour only – the piece cannot include any representational content)

Drawing:

3. a. Black and White: pencil, pen and ink, charcoal (not simply line drawing; must include a range of grays – light, medium and dark)
b. Colour: coloured pencils, pastels, felt markers
4. **Painting:** acrylic, oil, tempera, watercolour, etc. (representational)
5. **Printmaking:** block print, lino-cut, silk screen, etc.

Mixed Media:

6. **LYNDA LYNN, ARTIST - SPECIAL AWARD** - \$20.00 for best entry in Mixed Media - more than one art medium used in the same piece; e.g. pen and ink with water based paint, painting in any medium with textured pieces attached, e.g. fabric, yarn, wood, metal, wire.

ART (continued)

Sculpture:

7. **ROSSEAU LAKE COLLEGE SPECIAL AWARD** – \$20.00 for best entry of a 3-dimensional form/sculpture – any medium except wood.

Computer and Graphic Art:

8. **TOWN OF BRACEBRIDGE SPECIAL AWARD** - \$20.00 to the youth demonstrating the most potential in this category. Computer generated or graphic art – Design a logo representing your favourite activity.

CLASS 37 PHOTOGRAPHY

Note: Prints in items 1, 2 and 4 – 10 and 13 may be B/W or colour, **10cm x 15cm** (4" x 6") approximately. Mount leaving 1 – 2 cm border. Digitally enhanced photos are allowed only in item 13.

Note: The photo clearly sends an intended message. It follows one of the “rules” of composition and technique: rules of thirds, repetition or pattern, isolation by focus or location, decisive camera location/ perspective.

Note: Any pictures of persons must have permission of subject/guardian before exhibiting.

PEOPLE’S CHOICE AWARD – SPONSORED BY SAM PRATT, - \$20.00 for the Best Single Photo in Show. Visitors to the Youth Fair will be given an opportunity to choose the photo that most interests them. The ballot box will be closed on Sunday at 1:00 p.m. and the winner will be acknowledged with a Rosette after the ballots are counted.

BRACEBRIDGE PHOTOGRAPHY CLUB TROPHY – \$20.00 to the Youth with the highest points in this Class.

1. Nature – focuses on an element of nature that informs, reveals or educates. It communicates some kind of awe or power of nature (animal behaviour, weather, circumstance)
2. Water – clearly demonstrates the characteristics and qualities of water: fluidity, reflectivity, transparency, buoyancy, etc.
3. Tie dye
4. Animal(s) – like the “nature category. The choices reveal something unique and awe inspiring about animals.

PHOTOGRAPHY (continued)

5. Friendship – a clear bond between two or more creatures/ people that shows something about the inter connections between the beings.
6. Motion – use photographic technique to enhance and portray a sense of motion.
7. Portraiture – reveals/presents a mood or character of the individual; the technique strategically enhanced the character.
8. Sport.
9. My favourite photo
10. Photo of the exterior of the historic Carnegie Library in Bracebridge – **TOWN OF BRACEBRIDGE SPECIAL AWARD** - \$20.00 for the best entry.
11. Micro-photography – botany based – (photo using a microscope) 8.5" x 11" - **BMLSS STUDENT PARLIAMENT SPECIAL AWARD** – \$20.00 for the best entry.
12. Black & White photo – any subject – **SAM PRATT SPECIAL AWARD** – \$20.00 for the best entry.
13. Digitally enhanced PHOTO – 10 cm x 15 cm approx. - mount leaving 1 – 2 cm border

FABRICLAND MUSKOKA SPECIAL AWARD – \$20.00 Gift Certificate for the best entry in Sewing.

1. Any article of clothing in sewing (hand or machine stitched), e.g. sleep pants/pyjama bottoms, shirt, skirt, etc. (All seams should be finished.)
2. Any other sewing project – e.g. pincushion, stuffed animal, doll clothing, pot holder, table runner, etc.
3. Something new out of something old – create an article from recycled fabric, knitted materials, etc. – e.g. purse or bag made from old clothing, mitts made from an old sweater.
4. Needlecraft - Knitting, Crochet, Latch Hook, Embroidery, etc. - **TOWN OF BRACEBRIDGE SPECIAL AWARD** - \$20.00 for the best entry in Needlecraft.

BMLSS QUILTING AWARD - \$20.00 for the best entry in quilting.

5. Quilted item – bag, potholder, wallet, placemat, etc., hand or machine quilted
6. Quilt Block – ~12.5” (~32 cm) unfinished square

1. Jewellery – any jewellery using any medium (a pair of earrings counts as 1 piece) (no kits).
2. Pressed flower craft.
3. Garden décor item.
4. Card making or bookmark – may be handmade paper.
5. Holiday article – Hallowe'en, Thanksgiving, Christmas, -e.g. ornament, stocking, wreath, etc.
6. Ceramics – 1 piece, will be judged on painting, glazing, firing of a mould of your choice.
7. **SPECIAL DESIGN** (e.g. Models, books, doll house, shadow box, etc.). No kits. Will be judged on complexity, creativity and originality. **THE CAIRNS FAMILY MEMORIAL AWARD**
Prizes: 1st - \$30.00 2nd - \$20.00 3rd - \$10.00

CLASS 40 BAKING and NUTRITION

Note: All entries (except # 1) **must** be on a white plate and covered in a tied or Ziploc plastic bag.

Note: All entries **must** be made from scratch

SMART FAMILY SPECIAL AWARD - \$20.00 for the most points in Baking.

1. Trail mix – in a **250 ml./8 oz.** mason jar.
2. Decorated cupcakes – 3 cupcakes, judged on taste and decoration – your choice of theme
3. Sweet treat – 3 pieces on a plate. May be baked or no bake
4. Healthy School Lunch suitable for a High School aged Student (display on paper plate and wrapped with plastic bag) - **B.M.L.S.S. SPECIAL AWARD**– \$ 20.00 for Best Healthy School Lunch.
5. Muffins – your choice – 3 on a plate
6. Quick bread – loaf of banana, lemon, pumpkin, etc.

BAKING and NUTRITION (continued)

7. **CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIE CONTEST** - Three (3) Plain Chocolate Chip Cookies, **no nuts** – cookies no larger than 6.75 cm and no smaller than 5 cm. displayed on a clean, sturdy plate inside a clear plastic bag – OPEN to Youth up to age 15 years as of December 31, 2020. Exhibits in this Class will be combined with Junior Fair for judging.

District Competition

The winner from each Fair/Exhibition will be eligible to enter at the District Competition.

District entry must consist of 8 cookies displayed on a clean, sturdy plate (no paper plates) inside of a clear plastic bag with the exhibitor's name and address using the entry tag provided.

Plain chocolate chip cookies, with no nuts, must be no larger than 3" (6.75 cm) and no smaller than 2" (5 cm).

Prize money to be paid by the District.

Provincial Competition

The entrant must be the winner from the District Competition.

In the case where the district winner is unable to send an entry to the convention, then the 2nd place District winner will be eligible to enter.

The entry for the District must consist of 8 cookies displayed on a clean, sturdy plate (no paper plates) inside of a clear plastic bag with the exhibitor's name, address and District represented using the entry tag provided.

Plain Chocolate Chip Cookies, with no nuts are to be no larger than 3" (6.75 cm) and no smaller than 2" (5 cm).

Provincial Prize Money: 1st - \$20.00 2nd - \$15.00 3rd - \$10.00 with 12 prizes of \$5.00

8. **BEST BREAD YOUTH CONTEST** – made by exhibitor under **16 years of age**, sponsored by **MUSKOKA NATURAL FOOD MARKET**. 1 loaf of yeast bread of your choice, judging will be based on appearance, taste, texture, recipe creativity and presentation. Exhibits in this Class will be combined with Junior Fair for judging.

1. Wooden article (e.g. bird house, jewellery box, trunk, window box, wooden toy, bench, stool, carved item, sign)
2. Wood turning (e.g. lamp base, candlesticks, table leg, vase, pen)

Senior (16 – 19 years)

3. Wooden article (as above)
4. Wood turning (as above)

Note: Could be a group project.

Note: Entry to be on white paper with no name showing on the front.

Note: Use pen (no pencil).

1. **Write or copy** (cursive writing) 4 lines of poetry or song lyrics of your choice with title and author's name - **TOWN OF BRACEBRIDGE SPECIAL AWARD** - \$20.00 for the best entry.

CLASS 43 LITERARY

Note: All entries **must** be on white paper, either hand written or computer printed with no visible name showing

1. Short story – any topic, no longer than 2 pages – **MUSKOKA BOOKS SPECIAL AWARD** - \$20.00 for the best short story.
2. Poem – any topic – **GarDen PRESS - GARY DENNISS SPECIAL AWARD** - \$20.00 for the best poem.

CLASS 44 ENVIRONMENTAL

1. **Creation** - Item made from recycled material
WASTE CONNECTIONS CANADA SPECIAL AWARD - \$20.00 for the most creative entry using recycled material

CLASS 45 FIELD AND GARDEN

Please ensure containers are water tight.

SEASONS IN THE COUNTRY SPECIAL AWARD - \$20.00 Gift Certificate for the best entry in Sections 1, 2 and 3.

1. Roadside Beauty – bouquet of wild flowers, herbs, etc. in a container – natural materials only.
2. Small Floral Arrangement (real flowers) 15 cm x 15 cm. approx.
3. Autumn arrangement using a vegetable as container.
4. Three (3) blooms in a container (real flowers)
5. Arrangement (not a bouquet) using Muskoka forest material (all natural) – **B.M.L.S.S. SPECIAL AWARD** - \$20.00 for best entry.
6. Houseplant grown by exhibitor - **B.M.L.S.S. SPECIAL AWARD** – Young Gardener’s Award - \$20.00 for best entry.

SENIOR YOUTH POSTER COMPETITION

“Original hand-made design” - OPEN to Grades 9 – 12

Poster Size: Minimum approximately 22cm x 28cm, without border

Maximum approximately 28cm x 44cm, without border

Each entry must be centred on cardstock or Bristol board with approximately a 5.5 cm border on all four sides.

Topic is **“Promoting your Fair”**. Name and date of the fair must be shown on the poster. Must be hand drawn. The winner of this Poster Competition will go to District Level and the District winner will go to the OAAS Convention in February 2021.
