Notes:

1. A. V. means any variety; A.O.V. means any other variety
3. The general idea is to present each exhibit in the most attractive way possible for viewing by the general public. To this end, all exhibits may be washed or cleaned in other ways at exhibitor's choice.
4. Broccoli may have small leaves left on but cropped not above top of head.
5. Cabbage should have all excess leaves removed.
6. Carrots, leeks and other root crops should have their tops uniformly cropped (and not too short) and will be judged on uniformity of exhibit within the size limitations of the item where specified.
7. Onions should have only jagged and dirty outside scales removed, not peeled.
8. Potatoes should be dry cleaned, not washed.
9. All Tomatoes are to have stems and calyx on.
10. Potatoes classed as early include Chaleur, Chippewa, Irish Cobbler, Jemseg, Norland, Red Pontiac, Superior, Warba, Yukon Gold and similar varieties.
11. Potatoes classed as medium/mid-season include Chieftain, Goldrush, Nipigon, Shepody, Trent and similar varieties.
12. Potatoes classed as late include Banana, Belle Isle, Katahdin, Kennebec, Netted Gem/Russet Burbank, Rideau, Sebago and similar varieties.
13. Squash, Items #46 & #47 are to be named and judging criteria will include trueness to type.
14. Potatoes, Items #30, #31, #32 are to be named.
