Exhibits must be dropped off between **3:00-9:00pm on Thursday only**.
 Entries will be judged on Friday and must remain in place at the owner's risk until 4:00pm on **Sunday**. *Anyone removing exhibits before 4:00 pm shall forfeit their prize money.*
 Items must be picked up between 4:00-5:00pm.



- Notes:
1. All articles must be handcrafted by using needle art techniques, design and stitched in harmony with suitable materials (fibres).
 2. The Committee is authorized to disqualify all soiled, defaced or old work. Articles must be free of offensive odours and may be eliminated/disqualified prior to judging.
 3. The judges are instructed to award prizes for new and up to date work worthy of a prize and the work of the exhibitor.
 4. All items must be made by exhibitor unless otherwise stated.
 5. Exhibitors may enter only one item per section unless otherwise stated.
 6. Use safety pins to attach Entry Tags; no straight pins allowed.
 7. Afghan measurements do not include the fringe.
 8. Items may only be exhibited once, with the exception of UFOs, which can be shown again as a finished quilt.
 9. "Item" is one article, with the exception of a pair of socks or mitts.

**CLASS 76
QUILTING**

- Notes:
1. Every quilt must consist of three (3) layers (outer fabric, filler, and outer fabric).
 2. All work must be done by the individual entering article if hand quilted.
 3. Name of pattern must be provided.
 4. No identifying names or addresses on back of quilt.
 5. Name of person doing the quilting **MUST** be on the entry tag.

Special Awards:

1. Rosette awarded to the **BEST QUILT** in each of the hand and machine quilted categories. The winner from each category gains entry to the OAAS Competition.
2. \$25.00 Gift Certificate donated by **Fabricland** to the exhibitor earning most points in Quilting.
3. \$20.00 Gift Certificates donated by **Thimbles and Things** to each of the winners of Item 1(j) – small quilted item, Item 2(f) – wall hanging, and Item 2(m) – quilt.

HAND QUILTED ONLY

- Note: Quilts in sections a) – g) must be a minimum of 324" measured on perimeter to be considered for further competition. Smaller sizes will still be judged but will not be eligible to proceed to the next level of competition.

MACHINE QUILTED ONLY

- Notes:
1. Quilts in sections a) – c) must be a minimum of 324" measured on perimeter to be considered for further competition. Smaller sizes will still be judged but will not be eligible to proceed to the next level of competition.

2. Realizing that quilts now are done by long arm machines, it has become necessary to request that names of both the quilter and the person who has assembled the quilt to be presented on the Entry Form so acknowledgement can be given. These quilts must be quilted and assembled solely by the exhibitor in order to enter District Competition.

- 1A. Skein - spun by a novice spinner who has spun less than 2 years
- 2A. Skein - spun by an experienced spinner
- 3A. Skein - spun into a novelty yarn
- 4A. Skein - spun from exotic fibre (any non-sheep fibre)
- 5A. An item made from 100% handspun yarn made by spinner

WEAVING

- 1B. An item of clothing
- 2B. Table runner
- 3B. A decorative item
- 4B. Tote bag made by weaver
